
August














ASSAM FLOOD RELIEF WORK:-


September


ONAM CELEBRATION AT PRATHEEKSHA HOME:-


Volunteers divided themselves into various groups and carried out assigned works given to them like cleaning the surroundings, helping with kitchen works etc.


AND TECHNOLOGY celebrated the

February


3 DAY ADVENTURE CAMP:-

BREAK THE CHAIN CAMPAIGN:-


As Prevention is better than cure the Government of Kerala had started a

ENVIRONMENTAL DAY OBSERVATION:-


